CHIME Survey

- eHI conducted a joint survey with CHIME to assess the use of data and analytics within hospitals and health networks.
- Over 90 responses received during four-week period.
- Areas of focus were:
 - types of data used
 - types of analytic functions used
 - types of functions needed
 - challenges to the use of data and analytics



Respondents

- CIO members of CHIME
- Type of organizations
 - Community hospital (36%)
 - Multi-hospital (30%)
 - Academic medical center (16%)
 - Clinic (8%)
- 73% of organizations reported annual revenues of more than \$10,000,000
- 77% are using analytics software




Is Your Organization Part of an HIE?

- No (22%)




Most Important Uses of Data Reported by Respondents


- Clinician utilization and outcomes (30%)

- Patient care delivery (7%)




Actual Reported Uses of Data




What Do You Consider to Be Inappropriate Uses of EHR Data?




Where Majority of Analytical Resources are Directed

- No (72%)




Challenges to Using Data and Analytics

- Lack of standardized data across systems
- Lack of a system infrastructure to support analytics
- Cost of analytic software
- Concerns about privacy & security of data
- Lack of data integration
- Limited utility of the results to the organization




What Does Healthcare Look Like in 2020

MEASUREMENT AND USE OF BUSINESS INTELLIGENCE

To what extent does your organization measure and utilize business intelligence related to value in the following areas?

	Not	Measure	Manage
Costs of Adverse Events	43%	37%	20%
Margin Impact of Readmissions	38%	42%	20%
Cost of Waste in Care Processes (i.e. duplicative/unnecessary tests/procedures)	50%	29%	21%


Not We do not measure.




