#### **Research Background**

- In-depth interviews
  - Executives of provider and Health Information
    Exchange organizations
  - Ability to collect, exchange, and use patient data for population health management



#### **Key Findings**

- Access to timely and quality data still a challenge for some
- Several options for sharing clinical data no perfect solution
- Incentives to accessing and sharing data:
  - Reporting for MIPs and Value Based Payment Models
  - Population Health Management
- HIEs Integral to data sharing



# Challenges to Data Collection and Exchange

- Different record systems across the continuum of care
- Use of several EHR vendors that don't talk to each other
- Mapping data from multiple EHR vendors requires time and resources
- Data Quality is a challenge
  - Incorrect coding
  - Dictation with problems of voice recognition
  - Incomplete data
  - Variation in structured data
- Providers not sharing data
- Systems of sharing such as Continuity of Care Documents (CCDs)
  - Provide large amounts of information, sometimes too large
  - Providers receive CCDs from multiple sources
- Difficult to collect claims data from third-party payers unless they are in a risk-sharing agreement
  - Some provider resistance to exchanging information with HIEs



# Data, Population Health Management and HIEs

- Quality data necessary for value based payment models
- Quality data necessary for Population Health Management (PHM)
- Delivering on PHM requires a well-managed partnership network
- HIEs support PHM:
  - Access and exchange of data
  - Some HIEs offer sophisticated PHM platforms for analytics and MACRA/MIPS reporting



# Emerging Data in HIEs and, more data to manage

- Social determinants of health
- Patient Generated Health Data
- Behavioral Health Data
- Medication Adherence Support
- Controlled substance tracking






#### Kansas Health Information Network: Overview

- 5.2 million unique patients in KHIN
- Over 25 million patients available for query through connections with other exchanges
- 9,900 providers
- 1,000+ healthcare organizations in production with CCDs and HL7v2
  - 120,000 HL7 messages daily
  - 9,000 CCDs daily




